2021 marks Fontbonne Ministries' twenty-first year of service as the Sisters of St. Joseph Toronto's latest expression of love for God and neighbour.

Over this time, Fontbonne Ministries has built on the Congregation's rich tradition of service in hospitals, schools, and social services and brought together unique responses to current and emerging community needs.

Fontbonne Ministries programs supported those facing challenges accessing safe and affordable housing and food – as well as people experiencing social isolation and loneliness.

Through offerings as diverse as rent-geared-to-income housing for older single women to pottery classes, drop-ins, movie nights and accessible yoga and tai chi classes, Fontbonne Ministries created more than just places where things happen.

It created safe, inclusive, welcoming, and connected communities.

With the outbreak of COVID-19 in 2020, the way Fontbonne Ministries served our communities changed as we continued to adapt and refine our support to meet needs as they emerged.



We also began to look more in depth at what we do, who we serve, how Fontbonne Ministries is seen in the community, and how to honour the Sisters who guided our first two decades.

Last December, we began to look at updating our **Mission and Values Statements** to reflect the next steps in our organization's development.

Led by Fontbonne Ministries'
Mission Integration team – Leanne
Kloppenborg and Sister Kristine
Fernandes – the first step was to
bring together a Working Group to
steer the process.

With the tagline "Our Joyful Purpose" in mind and composed of Fontbonne Ministries staff, Board members, and volunteers, the Working Group met every three weeks beginning in January 2021. Their first task? Developing a survey for our staff, Sisters, and CSJ staff and Associates, as well as Fontbonne Ministries' program participants, donors and community partners.

The survey was to capture the opinions of the widest group possible. It was given online, over the phone, and even via a "dotmocracy" for Mustard Seed guests set up and facilitated by Sister Kristine.

Our Mission

In the end, 111 stakeholders responded to the survey, and their responses were surprisingly consistent. What shone through was the high regard our stakeholders have for Fontbonne Ministries and our high standards of inclusion and care.

After several drafts, the proposed final version of the Mission Statement was presented to the Fontbonne Ministries Board of Directors on June 3 – and approved unanimously without revision.

The new Mission Statement was revealed to Fontbonne Ministries staff during our Founding Day celebrations on June 16, 2021, and we are pleased to share it with you here. With these three sentences and 67 words, our Mission Statement is both a toast to our past and a salute to the future we share with all those touched by the work we do.



We are a welcoming community where you are not alone, and everyone belongs.



As an inclusive social service organization, our programs foster personal well-being and creativity and respond to food and housing insecurity, social isolation and loneliness.



Wherever you are in your life, the spirit of our founders – the Sisters of St. Joseph of Toronto – inspires us to join with you in nourishing mind, body and heart.

Our Values

In addition to the Mission Statement, the Working Group also reviewed Fontbonne Ministries' Values Statements which had not been changed or reviewed in more than a decade.

Rather than change these core values – which were revealed by our surveys to be very important to all of our stakeholder groups – the Group looked instead to clarifying the language we use to ensure that what Fontbonne Ministries stands for is clear to everyone.



Respect

We value each person as a distinct expression of God's love and invite each other to discover and celebrate our unique gifts.



Advocacy

We respond to society's evolving needs and mobilize positive change through transformational leadership.



Community

We work together with neighbours and partners to build strong relationships that are mutually supportive and collaborative.



Accountability

We use the resources entrusted to us with care, and make sustainable choices that will benefit future generations.



Compassion

We give our full attention to each person and show understanding, empathy and sensitivity to their needs.

Our Vision

Our Vision Statement – **building welcoming and supportive communities and pursuing social change** – remains unchanged.

We are grateful to all those who participated in the creation of our new Mission and Values and who shared their perspective, experiences and opinions with us.

This coming fall, we'll be initiating our Strategic Planning process, setting our future direction beginning in 2022.

As with our Mission and Values Statements, there will be opportunities for consultation with, and input from, our stakeholder groups.
